





VDP VINEYARD CLASSIFICATION



GROSSE LAGE ("great site")

- The very best sites with historically proven quality
 - Equivalent to Grand Cru in Burgundy

ERSTE LAGE ("first site")

- Distinctive sites with characteristic terroir
 - Equivalent to Premier Cru

ORTSWEIN ("village wine")

• Very good sites that show the style of a particular village

• Equivalent to Villages

GUTSWEIN ("estate wine")

• Other estate-owned vineyards

• Often declassified from top sites (pre-selection or young vine selection)

RIESLING STYLES & QUALITY CATEGORIES

DRY WINES

• Trocken = Maximum 9 grams/liter RS

• GG (Grosses Gewächs) = Dry wine from a Grosse Lage site

OFF-DRY WINES

- Balanced wines, typically with 15-20 grams/liter RS
- Sometimes referred to as "Feinherb" or "Tradition"

PRÄDIKAT WINES WITH SWEETNESS

- Kabinett earliest picking, light & delicate (40-50 g/I RS)
- **Spätlese** later picking, riper and more aromatic (50-70 g/l RS)
 - Auslese very ripe, often with some botrytis (70-100 g/I RS)
 - Eiswein dessert wine from frozen grapes (120+ g/l RS)
- Beerenauslese dessert wine; 100% botrytis selection (120+ g/l RS)

• Trockenbeerenauslese - sweetest, stickiest dessert wine from fully shriveled grapes (180+ g/I RS)


ESTATE WINES

- Any style or quality level is possible, including Sekt

SINGLE-VINEYARD WINES

- 100% from one classified vineyard
- Any style or quality level is possible, including Sekt


DR. LOOSEN (MOSEL)

- Owned by Erni Loosen, international Riesling warrior.
- One of the most iconic and influential producers in all of Germany.
- Serious but accessible wines that reflect Erni's gregarious personality.
- Family winegrowing tradition for over 200 years.
- Focus on Grosse Lage (grand cru) single-vineyard sites.
- Three distinctive soil types: blue slate, red slate, red volcanic sandstone.
- Emphasis on old, ungrafted vines ("Alte Reben" up to 130 years old).
- Average annual production: 35,000 cases.



FRITZ HAAG (MOSEL)

- Legendary Mosel winery with a global cult following.
- Renowned for the hyper-focused purity and mineral intensity of their Rieslings.
- Small, family estate founded in 1605.
- 72 acres of estate-owned vineyards in and around Brauneberg.
- Extremely steep vineyards with Devonian slate soils.
- Current owner and winemaker is Oliver Haag.
- Dedicated member of the VDP.
- Average annual production: 15,000 cases.


MAXIMIN GRÜNHAUS (RUWER/MOSEL)

- Deeply historic and revered estate in the tiny Ruwer valley.
- Formerly a Benedictine monastery, founded in the 7th century.
- Very distinctive expression of terroir and winemaking style.
- Current owners are Maximin & Amelie von Schubert, the sixth generation.
- Estate vineyards are wholly owned, monopole sites with slate soil.
- Traditional winemaking: 100% native yeast fermentation.
- Maximin's father, Carl von Schubert, is president of the Mosel VDP.
- Average annual production: 12,500 cases.


ZILLIKEN (SAAR/MOSEL)

- Highly acclaimed estate in the cooler-climate Saar valley.
- Renowned for featherlight Rieslings that "float like a butterfly."
- A family winegrowing tradition since 1742 emphasis on <u>family</u>.
- Current owner is Dorothee Zilliken, the seventh generation.
- 30 acres of estate vineyards in Saarburg, Ockfen and Ayl.
- Traditional winemaking in 1,000-liter Fuder casks.
- Deepest cellar in the Saar Valley stays perfectly cool and wet.
- Average annual production: 6,000 cases.


ROBERT WEIL (RHEINGAU)

- Internationally renowned as the leading estate of the Rheingau region.
- Known for their intensity and precision at all quality levels.
- Founded in 1875 by the great-grandfather of owner Wilhelm Weil.
- The 1893 Kiedricher Berg Auslese established their reputation with European royalty.
- 100% Riesling from 220 acres of top-rated vineyards.
- Hillside sites with stony, loamy soils over slate bedrock.
- Meticulous viticulture, strict selection at harvest and impeccable winemaking.
- Wilhelm Weil is president of the Rheingau VDP.
- Average annual production: 60,000 cases.



WITTMANN (RHEINHESSEN)

- One of the top two estates in Rheinhessen.
- Intense, powerful wines from top vineyard sites based on limestone soil.
- Family winegrowing tradition since 1663.
- Now owned by Philipp & Eva Wittmann.
- Philipp's father was a pioneer in organic viticulture in the early 1990s.
- The entire 62-acre estate was converted to Biodynamic farming in 2004.
- Entry-level line of "100 Hills" wines are certified Organic.
- Average annual production: 15,000 cases.








VILLA WOLF (PFALZ)

- Managed by winemaker Patrick Möllendorf, who started as an apprentice at Dr. Loosen.
- Estate vineyards achieved organic certification in 2021.
- Value line of vibrant wines from classic Pfalz region varieties.
 - Same dedication to quality and value as with Dr. L.
 - Frequently named "Best Buys" in major wine publications.
- Average annual production: 35,000 cases




