

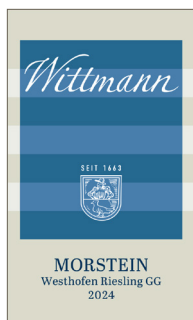

“Philipp Wittmann called 2024 a ‘classically Nordic ripening of fruit’ Wittmann said. ‘August and September were really good, a wonderful late summer.’ Wittmann’s team went through the Riesling sites and made pre-harvests to help concentrate the remaining fruit. Wittmann Morstein Riesling GG 2024

Still very young, this masterpiece of dry Riesling has enormous textural complexity. Gigantic concentration, but also very racy. Great citrus and herbal freshness as well as formidable acidity in the extremely long, focused finish. *August 19, 2025. Reviewed by Stuart Pigott*

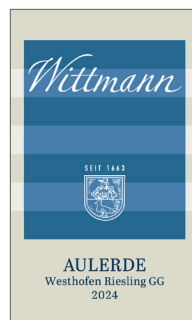
[98] *Vinous*

Flickers with yeast, chervil and lemon zest in equal measure. The palate is so cool and calm. There is something utterly serene here, with the purest lemon and limestone. It is enduring and eternally calm. This may be quieter than other Morstein vintages, but it has confidence. The 2024 is fresh, bright and salty. *September 11, 2025 — Reviewed by: Anne Krebiehl MW*

[95] *Mosel Fine Wines*

Offers a beautifully delicate and complex nose of yellow flowers, aniseed, almond, light toast, acacia, may tree, and licorice. The wine shows great finesse on the palate, and only gradually shows the more forceful side of Morstein as it gains weight and intensity. Yet the finish process superbly elegant, refined, and playful, with some tickly acidity and a bone-dry feel. The energy is beautiful. This is a splendid Morstein GG, with depth and freshness. *September 2025*

Wittmann Aulerde Riesling GG 2024

The very exciting nose of licorice, white thorn blossoms and Mirabelle plum pulls you into this compact an impressively structured dry Riesling that deftly combines warm and cool elements. Then comes the compact and well-structured finish. — *August 19, 2025.*

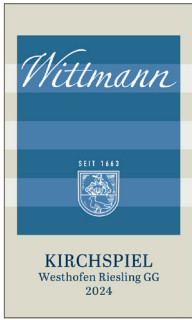

Just a touch of reduction trembles on the nose, with a lovely flicker of anise and a streak of peach. The palate is smooth, straight and linear but with wonderful fill and fluidity. Wittmann Kirchspiel Riesling GG 2024

With every turn of the glass this expands and expands. Concentrated, with the excellent ripeness of the cool vintage. Very racy and chalky acidity makes this feel lighter than it really is on the medium-bodied palate. Try to be patient, because this is on a steep upward curve. — August 19, 2025. The nose is alive with crushed chervil and lemon.

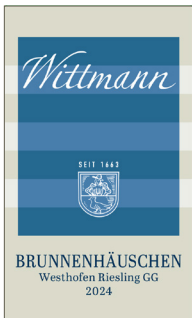

[92] Mosel Fine Wines

Delivers a beautifully refined and subtly herbal nose of fresh almond, greengage, thyme, freshly cut herbs, lemon, and conference pear. The wine is superbly structured and playful on the palate, with nice grip and intensity. There are plenty of zesty and spicy elements joining the party and giving a very pure and lively side. However, the finish is slightly broader and more impactful, with just a touch of power coming through. This is a great dry Riesling, with both intensity and freshness. September 2025

Wittmann Brunnenhäuschen Riesling GG 2024

Kaleidoscopic nose of pink grapefruit, passion fruit, citrus zest and honeysuckle. Very concentrated, creamy and racy all at once. Fantastic energy and elegance in the very long, chalky finish. — August 19, 2025. Reviewed by Stuart Pigott

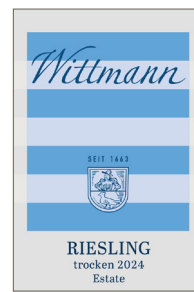
Just a touch of yeast swings on the nose that has a subtle sense of angelica and creamy moss.

The palate is smooth and serene. It is mellow in a very cool fashion. There is a lovely core of limestone and lemon framing its beautiful, supple substance. This is a splendid expression with calm personality. September 11, 2025 — Reviewed by: Anne Krebiehl MW

[93] Mosel Fine Wines

Immediately catches one's attention with hugely aromatic and complex scents of smoke, herbal tea, ginger, lavender, plum, licorice, and minty herbs, all wrapped in a touch of camphor. The wine proves compact and slightly juicy on the palate and leaves a broader and quite intense feel of herbs and candied citrus fruits. The long finish is also focused and tart at this early stage. This is an impressive Brunnenhäuschen, with good freshness. September 2025

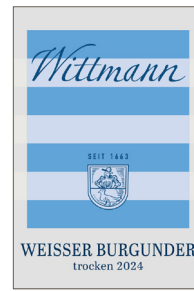
Wittmann Estate Riesling Trocken 2024

Cool and herbal on the nose, this youthful, entry-level dry Riesling has a wealth of citrus aromas and a chalky character on the compact, medium-bodied palate. Impressive length for this category, and the crisp, lemony acidity is beautifully integrated. March 19, 2025. Reviewed by Stuart Pigott

Wittmann Weisser Burgunder (Pinot Blanc) 2024

There's quite some leesy complexity on the medium-bodied palate of this excellent dry Pinot Blanc. Creamier on the palate than the citrus and crisp pear nose suggests, no doubt due to some malolactic fermentation. A well-rounded and well-structured mid-palate and a long, chalky finish. Wittmann Niersteiner Riesling Trocken "Aus Ersten Lagen" 1G 2024

Very smoky and racy, this is a wonderful, medium-bodied wine with a filigreed and stony finish that is very long and straight. Excellent aging potential. — August 19, 2025. Reviewed by Stuart Pigott

[93] Vinous

Crushed tansy, a flicker of smokiness, a hint of grapefruit spice and the merest touch of red apple peel appear on the nose. This has fill and all the flavor of red Permian stone. It tingles with herb and tangerine notes, making the mouth water with a beautiful stoniness. Yet all is slender, straight, wonderfully bracing and bright. What a lovely tonic. Wittmann Westhofener Riesling Trocken “Aus Ersten Lagen” 1G 2024

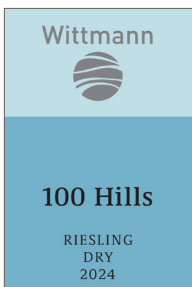
The stunning cool peach and wild herb aromas pull you into this sleek and impressively structured dry wine that has so much drive and energy. Stunning length, but you need to like acidity to fully enjoy this. – August 19, 2025.

A lovely sense of chervil and moss join a certain creaminess on the nose, while the cool palate plunges into a note of lemon zest. This is as mouthwatering as pale lemon peel. Wittmann 100 Hills Riesling Dry 2024

The forthright citrus and yellow apple aromas pull you into this juicy, barely medium-bodied dry Riesling, the touch of melted butter character helping to round out the finish.

Wittmann La Borne Riesling Trocken Alte Reben 2024

With its licorice and fennel aromas, this is a very powerful wine for the cool, high-acidity 2024 vintage. Incredible structure and elegance on the very concentrated, medium-bodied palate. – August 19, 2025.

[95] Mosel Fine Wines

Initially only delivers notes of wheat, thyme, laurel, hay, and cassis, before showing great complexity and refined notes of candied grapefruit, yellow peach, fine spices, and almond cream. The wine coats the palate with a great combination of delicate yellow fruits and refreshing spices and herbs. The finish is very long and impressive. This is a superb dry Riesling in the making.
